Notification
to the Governments of the States Parties
to the Geneva Conventions of 12 August 1949
for the Protection of War Victims

SUCCESSION OF ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA
TO THE FOUR GENEVA CONVENTIONS

On 6 October 1986, Antigua and Barbuda has deposited with the Swiss Government a declaration of succession to the four Geneva Conventions of 12 August 1949 for the Protection of War Victims, as there are:

- Convention for the Amelioration of the Condition of the Wounded and Sick in Armed Forces in the Field,
- Convention for the Amelioration of the Condition of Wounded, Sick and Shipwrecked Members of Armed Forces at Sea,
- Convention relative to the Treatment of Prisoners of War,
- Convention relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War.

According to the international practice, Antigua and Barbuda has become a party to the four said Conventions at the date of its independence, i.e. on 1 November 1981.

The present notification is made by the Swiss Government in its capacity of Depositary of the Geneva Conventions.
