ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND EMPLOYMENT



2,728 new and/or improved jobs for young people (42% women) created, with 82 companies accessing new markets.

CHF 11.4 million invested by the private sector in business improvements and expansions.

777 micro and small businesses supported (40% owned or managed by women), all still operational.

39 companies provided enhanced work-based learning and mentoring for **643** TVET students.

LOCAL GOVERNANCE AND MUNICIPAL SERVICES



780,000 people now use safely managed drinking water.

630,000 people benefited from disaster risk reduction measures.

217 civil society organisations were supported in their dialogue with local authorities.

13,500 citizens participated in decision-making processes in their communities.

HEALTH



1.4 million women and men in 37 municipalities gained access to community nursing services.

200,000 people from marginalized groups (54% women) received community nursing services.

3,500 elderly people (68% women) in 10 municipalities benefited from innovative home-based care provided by auxiliary nurses.

74 community mental health centres provide services in accordance with mental health standards.

MIGRATION



Around **40,000** migrants gained access to local healthcare services.

Partnership between private sector in BiH and diaspora generated investments worth **CHF 443,000**.

Strengthened capacities of the BiH Ministry of security and its agencies on policy and operational level.

MINE ACTIONS



BiH declared free of cluster ammunition. Switzerland supported the clearance operations until their completion.

3 million m² of contaminated land cleared of mines and cluster ammunition.

Brčko District will be free of mines by 2025.

JUSTICE



Archives of criminal cases in all prosecutor's offices fully digitalised.

Over the past 4 years, a total of 57 indictments were issued in cases of high corruption, which is **119%** more than in the period 2014-2018.
