

#### The Flying Dutchman - Richard Wagner / Irish National Opera

23-29 March 2025 Bord Gáis Energy Theatre, Dublin



The Dutchman's mysterious ghost ship is doomed to roam the seas until he finds true love on land. The young Senta dreams of the mythical Dutchman and longs to break his curse. But a chance to do so only occurs every seven years.

**Wagner**'s epic score brilliantly captures the vast scale of the story, from the stormy overture to the final scene of tragedy and redemption. *The Flying Dutchman* is directed by Rachael **Hewer**. Irish National Opera's artistic director, **Fergus Sheil**, conducts the Irish National Opera orchestra and chorus.
