Exchange of the Swiss driving license:

The Swiss driving license has to be exchanged 6 months after taking up residency. For further and reliable information on this subject, please contact the responsible authority: https://island.is/en/foreign-driving-licences

In case the Icelandic authorities require a certificate of validity of the driving licence, this must be requested from the cantonal <u>road traffic office</u> that issued the licence.

Life and civil status certificate: changes as per 2022

As of 2022, a new life verification process came into effect thanks to the implementation of automated exchanges with various partner administrations of the Central Compensation Office. The insured persons concerned by these exchanges will no longer receive the « Life status » form to be certified.
