Processing time

You can file your visa application at the earliest 6 months before the planed travel to Switzerland. Processing time is about 5 to 7 days but can be longer. The appointment list usually being booked solid for two weeks, you should start your application at least one month before

Visa fee: To be paid in cash and in FCFA at the counter Adults and children above 12 years: € 80 Children between 6 and 12 years: € 40

In accordance with Art. 25a of the Visa Code (cooperation on the readmission of irregular migrants) and based on a report of the European Commission, Schengen area Member States decided to temporarily adopt an implementing decision with respect to The Gambia.

Visa free of charge for: Children below 6 years Spouse or partner of UE or EFTA citizen. (marriage certificate has to be submitted)
