tionals who move abroad must register with the competent representation within 90 days after deregistering in Switzerland. You must provide proof that you have deregistered at your last commune of domicile in Switzerland. Anyone who acquires Swiss citizenship by descent, (re)naturalisation or adoption and already holds residence in their respective consular district is also entered in the register of the Swiss Abroad. Inclusion in the register provides Swiss nationals living abroad with guidance on official acts, including the issuance of passports, civil status matters and consular protection services, etc.

The shipment of the Swiss Revue is handled by a designated shipping partner of the Organization of the Swiss Abroad (OSA). In order to facilitate this, the relevant personal data (such as surname, first name, address, e-mail) of the individual is disclosed to this third-party provider.
