Goals of the 2014 Presidency of the Swiss Confederation

Politics - meaning "the affairs of the city" - serves the interests of society as a whole. In 2014, there were three main areas of focus: young people, work and an open outlook.

Firstly, young people – allowing the younger generation to achieve their aspirations and to enjoy good prospects is a key objective of political action. Establishing good framework conditions to provide jobs, especially for young people, and ensuring a high-performance system of education and research - through the combined school/work-based vocational model in particular - are key factors. At a time when some countries are experiencing a severe crisis in terms of prospects for young people, Switzerland must make every effort to hold on to its strengths.

Work is a key element for including everyone in society. Switzerland enjoys good conditions in this respect; jobs are being created here. We must ensure that this remains the case in future. We must also continue to

promote work as a virtue that is necessary to achieve success and maintain Switzerland's leadership qualities.

The controlled opening-up to the world around us has always been one of Switzerland's strengths. Since the days of the old Swiss Confederation, trade across the Alps has always been a key economic factor for our nation. Today, Switzerland earns every other franc from trade abroad and one in three francs from trade with Europe. Switzerland knows how to take advantage of a globalised world by opening up markets and focusing on quality and innovation. An open outlook is a success factor for Switzerland and is in keeping with its values of individual liberty, solidarity and responsibility towards the world around us. This outlook is also in the country's interest because a stable and more secure world is better for Switzerland.

Young people, work and an open outlook are three key assets in continuing to ensure that the constitutional objectives of independence, prosperity and national security are achieved.

Progress towards the goals of the2014 Presidency of the Swiss Confederation

1. Young people: politics serving the interests of future generations

Strengthening professional education, training and research

- International exchange on the dual vocational model combining classroom education and work-based training, in particular during visits to Austria, Poland, Japan and the United States
- Topic discussed during the state visit by the president of South Korea with a visit to a vocational education institution
- Swiss-Polish economic forum in Warsaw during the presidential visit, with vocational education and training as one of its themes
- Topic discussed at the opening of the WEF
- Various invitations sent to take part in the international conference addressing the combined model of vocational education and training in Winterthur in September 2014
- Solution with the EU for Switzerland's participation in the Horizon 2020 research programme until 2016; transitional solution at the national level for the Erasmus programme
- Support for vocational education and training and online studies in the francophone context

"Model OSCE" for young people

- The 57 young representatives of the participating States began their work in January in Vienna. Opening in the presence of the Chairperson-in-Office of the OSCE
- 2nd round of negotiations in Belgrade on 8-10 July
- Youth action plan adopted by consensus
- Presentation of the action plan at the OSCE Ministerial Conference in Basel from 4-5 December

Development on behalf of young people

- Project for the health of young girls: one of Switzerland's priorities during the 15th Francophonie Summit in Dakar.
- Project to counter the recruitment of child soldiers: action plan presented to the public in October
- "CMELL" project (freely accessible online courses): review after two years at the Francophonie Summit in Dakar (November) and launch of a new phase
- Launch of a model Francophonie organisation to raise awareness of peace and development issues among young people in the French-speaking world

Remembrance of the First World War

- Launch of a discussion about the war within postcompulsory schools in Switzerland as part of a presidential competition
- Meeting with ten school classes participating in this project in Geneva at the start of September
- Visit to Ypres (Belgium) together with the three school classes that produced the best projects, beginning of November

Young witnesses

- The granddaughter of a survivor of Auschwitz, Nathalie Gelbart from Lucerne, accompanied the Swiss president on a visit to Auschwitz.

- A young woman from Appenzell, Katrin Wyss, accompanied the president to the 200th anniversary of the canton of Geneva's accession to the Swiss Confederation. Together with Ms Morand, they discussed the topic of national cohesion.
- Switzerland's youth rep, Damian Vogt, accompanied the Swiss president to the opening week of the UN in New York (September).

Achieving progress on issues of neighbourhood relations
