

# Birth of a child in North Macedonia from married parents: entry in the Swiss civil status register

Birth certificate of the child in International Format (Form A) not older than 6 months.
foreign passport of the child, if available
passport copies of both parents
address of domicile of both parents

The original documents are submitted to the civil status authority concerned in Switzerland and must not be older than six months. They will not be returned. Photocopies are not accepted. Additional documents may be required if necessary.

#### Translation

Any judgment or decision drawn up in local languages must be translated into one of the official Swiss languages.

# Legalisation

With the exception of CIEC documents, all documents and court decisions must be certified by an apostille.

### Fees

Entry of the birth in the Swiss civil status register is free of charge.

## Further information and request for Swiss identity documents

A minimum period of two months for birth registration must be expected. The civil registry office responsible for the child's place of origin will provide information on the status of the registration after this period has expired and will issue official confirmations on request (e.g. a confirmation of birth).

Once the birth has been entered in the civil status register, parents can order a Swiss passport and/or an identity card via the website <a href="https://www.schweizerpass.ch">www.schweizerpass.ch</a>

If the Swiss parent is not registered with this embassy as a Swiss citizen abroad and the child will live in North Macedonia, the child must be registered as a Swiss citizen abroad. In this case, the fully completed registration form signed by both parents must also be submitted.

A regular Swiss identity card can only be ordered once the birth of the child has been entered in the Swiss civil status register or the child's Swiss citizenship has been confirmed.
