**This booklet is divided into two sections**

- Use of funds dedicated to international cooperation by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) and the Economic Cooperation and Development Division of the State Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO WE).

**Official development assistance (ODA): clarifications**

- Official development assistance (ODA) is defined on the international level as the total of all financial flows to developing countries and territories (currently 151) and to multilateral development organisations (i) from the public sector; (ii) with the promotion of economic development and welfare as its main objective; (iii) at concessional financial terms.
- The performances of donor countries are usually compared on the basis of the ODA percentage in their gross national income (GNI).
- To ensure the comparability and transparency of ODA contributions, the Development Assistance Committee (DAC) of the OECD has established comprehensive statistical reporting directives to regulate the reporting procedures of member countries. These rules define the activities and contributions that are ODA-eligible and are being periodically updated.
- Swiss ODA contributions stem mainly from the SDC and the SECO WE budgets. Other federal offices as well as 25 cantons and about 200 communes participate in Switzerland's international cooperation. In conformity with DAC's reporting rules, Switzerland also started to declare some years ago bilateral debt relief measures (within the framework of "the Paris Club") as well as the costs related to asylum seekers from developing countries during their first year of stay in Switzerland.

**Technical notes**

- The amounts shown are annual disbursements.
- Not all SDC and SECO WE expenditures are automatically incorporated in the ODA figures. Certain statistical adjustments are made in order to comply with the international directives (not included are disbursements intended for countries that are not on the list of developing countries, different notification method for certain multilateral contributions).
- The financial involvement of the SDC and SECO WE in the enlargement of the European Union (EU) is not reflected in detail in this booklet (see: [www.contribution-enlargement.admin.ch](http://www.contribution-enlargement.admin.ch)).

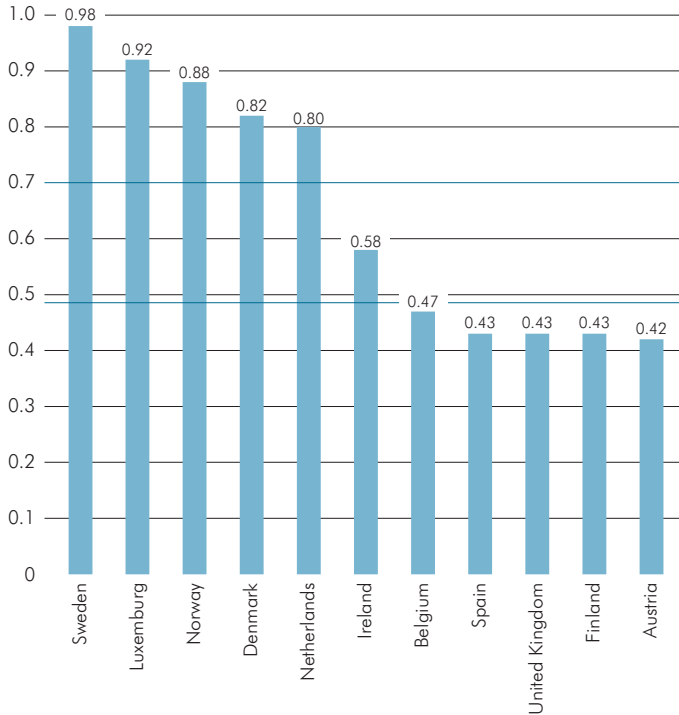

In 2008, the volume of official development assistance (ODA) rose by 10.5% over 2007. This growth is explained in particular by the large increase of costs for asylum seekers originating from developing countries, as well as debt relief measures. Expressed as a percentage of gross national income (GNI), ODA increased from 0.38% in 2007 to 0.42% in 2008.

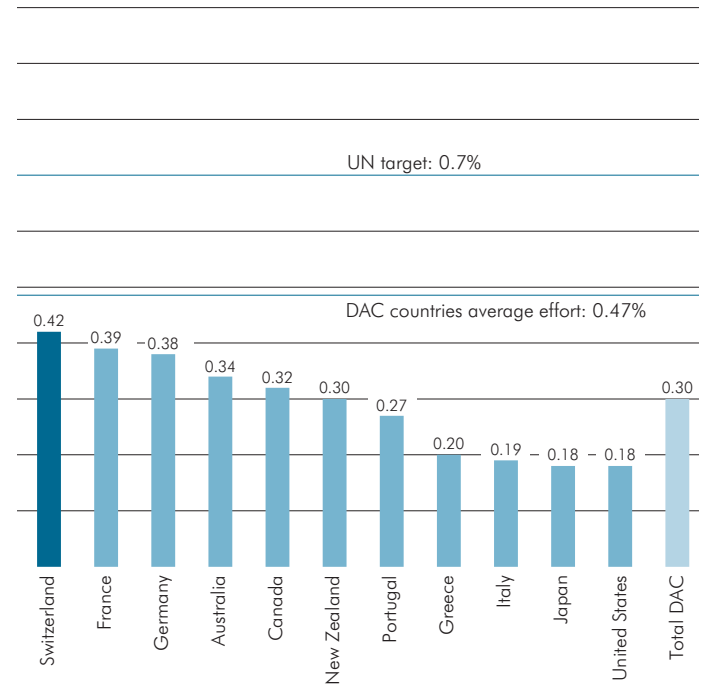
Private aid is provided by Swiss NGOs and other non-profit organisations and foundations for projects and programmes in developing countries. These private donations, which are largely collected directly from the population, represented an average of CHF 80 per head in 2007. They have increased from 0.06% of GNI in 2000 to 0.11% in 2007.

Provisional data of OECD's Development Assistance Committee (DAC) show that total ODA of the 22 member countries reached in 2008 the highest ever level of 120 billion US\$ (10% increase in real terms). Only five countries have attained or exceeded the ODA target of 0.7% set back in 1970 by the United Nations. With its ratio ODA/GNI of 0.42%, Switzerland ranks actually 12th. ODA data for all DAC countries will be revised end 2009.

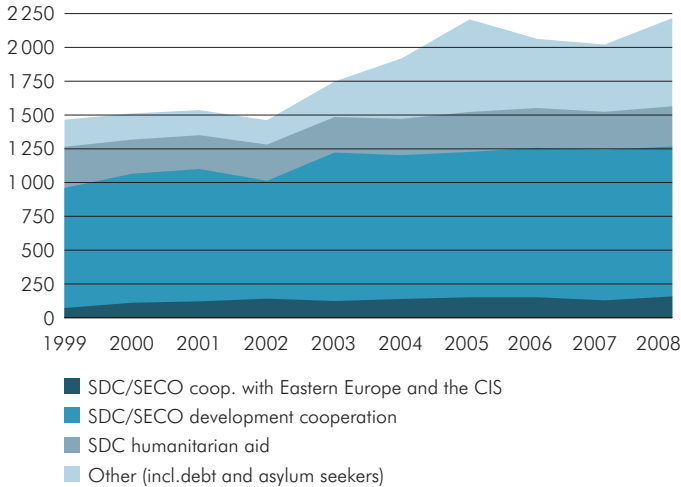

In 2008, the assistance to asylum seekers and debt relief measures changed the breakdown of ODA. The share of SDC and SECO (without debt) in ODA declined in 2008 (71%) in comparison to 2007 (75%).

The distribution between bilateral ODA (76%) and multilateral ODA (24%) slightly changed in 2008 (in 2007, resp. 75% and 25%).

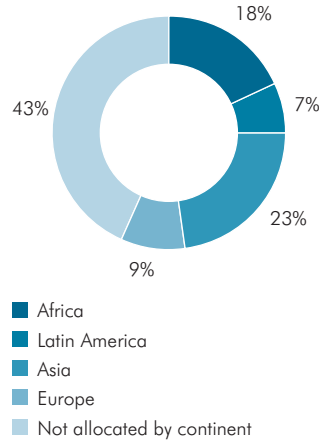

The statistical adjustments introduced from 2003 onwards have affected the breakdown of aid categories.

- The share of ODA attributed to the SDC’s and SECO development cooperation activities has decreased from 60% in the early 2000s to 50% in 2008.
- The share of humanitarian aid in ODA has diminished from 18% to 13% in 2008.
- The share of the SDC’s and SECO cooperation with the East remained at 7%.
- Contributions from other federal offices, cantons and communes, including statistical adjustments, represented in 2008 29% of the total (13% in 2000).

As in the past, Swiss bilateral ODA is principally intended for low-income countries and concentrated mainly in Africa and Asia (around 40% of total in 2008). Developing countries of Latin America and Europe absorbed together 16% of total bilateral ODA.

The amounts not distributed by continent (43%) amalgamate SDC’s programme contributions to Swiss NGOs and to the ICRC, costs of assistance to asylum seekers, mandates assigned for research, training purposes or thematic advice, as well as operating costs and logistics in Switzerland.

Multilateral ODA includes general contributions paid by SDC and other federal offices to international development institutions

Contributions to international non-governmental organisations (including the ICRC) are included in bilateral ODA.

Distribution between three pillars of multilateral ODA remained stable: around one third for the United Nations agencies, more than 50% for the international financial institutions.

Contributions to IFIs are registered in ODA at the time of the deposit and not of the payment of the “notes” (sight drafts). Large differences may result from one year to another.

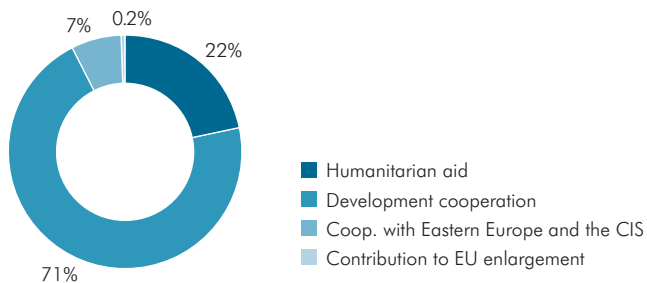

SECO WE Expenditures 2008: CHF 215 mil. CHF

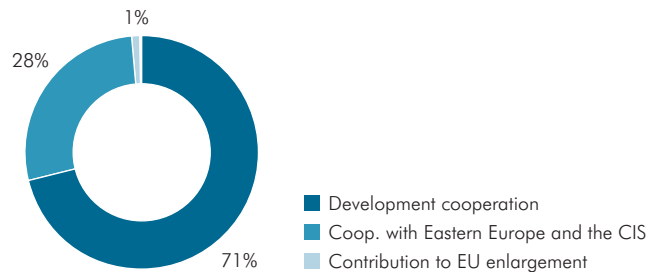

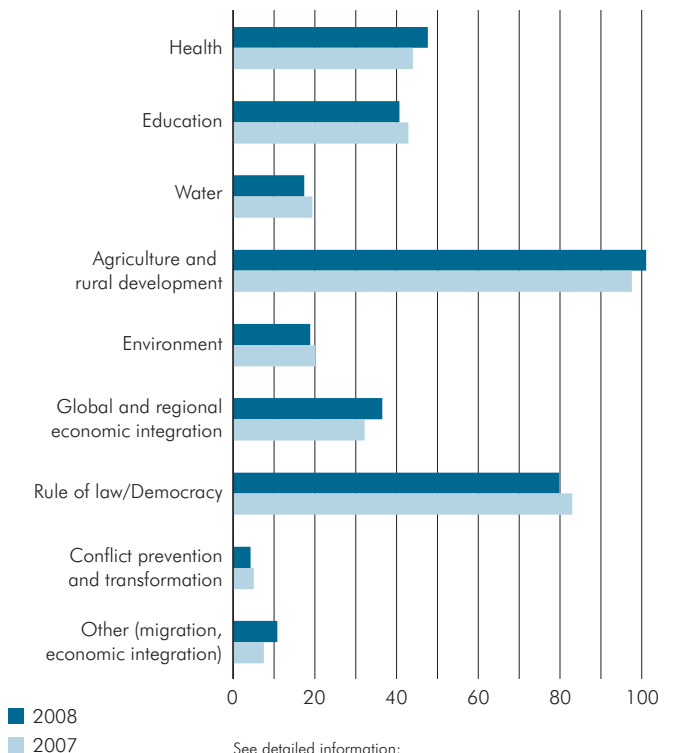

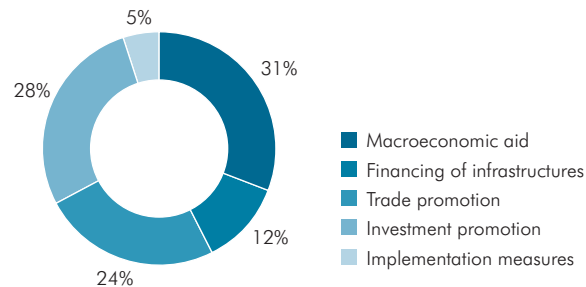

**Missions by Swiss Humanitarian Aid Unit (SHA) 2002–2008**

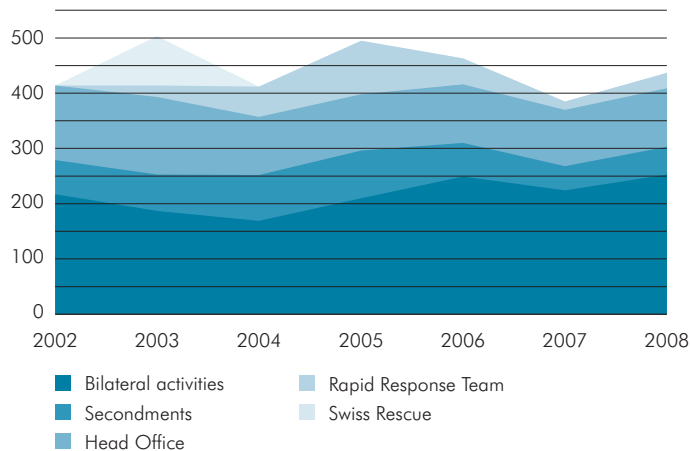

**SDC cooperation with Eastern Europe and the CIS by sector 2008**

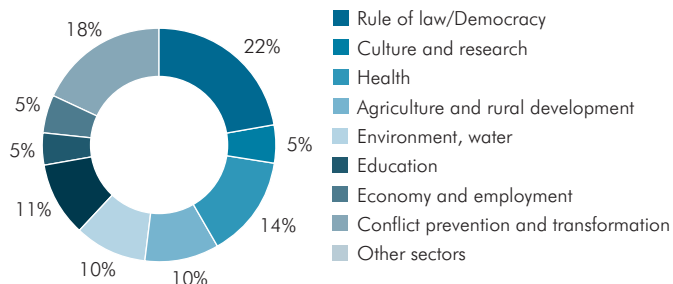

**SECO WE Cooperation with Eastern Europe and the CIS by instruments 2008**

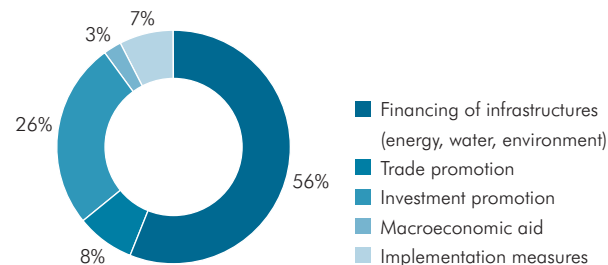
