### **COVID-19 rapid antigen test facility at CICG U.S. – Russia Summit, Geneva : June 16, 2021**

In order to obtain the badge giving access to media facilities, media representatives and related staff whose credentials have been approved by the FDFA are kindly requested to present one of the following document at the check counter in the entrance hall of CICG:

- a proof of **complete vaccination for COVID-19\***
- a **negative PCR test** carried out less than 72 hours before accreditation pick up
- a proof of a **negative antigen** test carried out less than 48 hours before pick up
- a proof of being **cured from COVID-19**

Persons who cannot present one of the above listed documents have to undergo a free rapid antigen test at the dedicated facility inside the CICG, before to be able to receive their badge.

\*with a vaccine approved in Switzerland, authorized by the European Medicines Agency for the European Union or authorized according to the WHO emergency list.

#### **COVID-19 antigen test facility – testing procedure**

- Location: access through the entrance hall of the CICG, rue de Varembé 17, 1202 Geneva
- Opening time:
  - **Mon. 14 June, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.**
  - **Tue. 15 June, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.**
  - **Wed. 16 June, 8 a.m. to 12 a.m.**
- Cost of the test: free of charge
- Data required upon register for the test: first name, last name, date of birth, email address, cell phone number.
- Each person will be taken a sample of the nose swab by dedicated personnel. The person will need to wait for approximately 15 min. in a dedicated area in order to receive the test result.
- If the result is negative, the person will receive a document confirming the result, to be presented at the accreditation counter in order to receive the badge.

#### **Procedure in case of positive test result**

In accordance with the procedure set out by the Swiss health authorities, persons who test positive to the rapid antigen test will have to:

- undergo a PCR test conducted onsite for free and leave the venue immediately with their face mask;
- go directly to their hotel without using public transportation and isolate in their hotel room and wait until they receive the result of the PCR test;
- if the PCR test is positive, the health authorities will order a 10-day isolation in Switzerland, and a contact tracing investigation will be conducted.

**Access to the venues is not permitted to persons with COVID-19 related symptoms, such as:**

- **Respiratory illness symptoms (sore throat, cough (usually dry), shortness of breath, chest pain);**
- **High temperature**
- **Sudden loss of sense of smell and/or taste**
