<b>Digital Policy</b>		<p>The <b>Geneva Internet Platform (GIP)</b> fulfils the mission of an observatory, a capacity building centre (online and in situ), and a centre for discussion. It provides a neutral and inclusive space for digital policy debates, recognised by the majority of global actors as a platform where different views can be voiced. The GIP serves diplomatic missions based in Geneva with tailored briefings on developments in internet governance politics, with a special focus on missions from small and developing countries. <b>Science</b>		<p>The <b>Geneva Science-Policy Interface (GSPI)</b> fosters and promotes cross-sectoral and interdisciplinary collaborations between researchers, policy actors and implementers to nurture fresh perspectives on current and emerging challenges relevant to International Geneva. Acting as a connector, broker of collaborative projects and amplifier of science-policy knowledge and practices, the GSPI aims to support the elaboration of evidence-based and impactful policies and practices. <b>Environment</b>		<p>The <b>Geneva Environment Network (GEN)</b>, led by UNEP, is a cooperative partnership of over 75 environment and sustainable development organizations based at the International Environment House and elsewhere in the Geneva region, including UN agencies and programmes, NGOs, local authorities and academic institutions. Development		<p>The <b>SDG Lab</b> is a multi-stakeholder initiative of the United Nations Office at Geneva (UNOG) that contributes to the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The Lab works with a diverse ecosystem of actors that are focused on delivering the 2030 Agenda and identifies strategic opportunities for convergence in order to energize and maximize the added-value of International Geneva in supporting implementation of the SDGs.</p> <p>The SDG Lab offers a space for interdisciplinary and multisectoral collaboration while consistently testing assumptions and asking questions about what is needed to achieve the 2030 Agenda. This dynamic Lab model strengthens the individual efforts of governments and organizations by amplifying their unique voices, creating space for new partnerships to form, and providing a platform to innovate and experiment. Global Health		<p>The <b>Global Health Centre</b> (GHC) is the Graduate Institute's research centre on governing the global health domain and global health diplomacy. Peace & Security		<p>The <b>Geneva Peacebuilding Platform</b> (GPP) is a knowledge hub that connects peacebuilding actors, resources, and expertise in Geneva and worldwide. The Platform has a mandate to facilitate interaction on peacebuilding between different institutions and sectors, and to advance new knowledge and understanding of issues and contexts related building peace. It also plays a creative role in building bridges between International Geneva, the United Nations peacebuilding architecture in New York, and peacebuilding activities in the field. The Platform's network comprises more than 4'000 peacebuilding professionals working on building peace directly or indirectly. It is co-founder of the Peace Talks Initiative and of Geneva Peace Week, a flagship event of International Geneva.
