



**Below is a list of the most commonly used types of inflatable life rafts for seagoing yachts sailing under the Swiss flag**

<b>ARIMAR</b>	(ISO 9650-1), Offshore + quipment pack > 24 hrs.
<b>AVON</b>	(ISO 9650-1), Ocean + equipment pack > 24 hrs.
<b>EUROVINIL</b>	(ISO 9650-1) + equipment pack > 24 hrs.
<b>PLASTIMO</b>	(ISO 9650-1), Transocean + Ausrüstungspack > 24 Std.
<b>VIKING</b>	(ISO 9650-1), RescYou , RescYou Pro
<b>ZODIAC</b>	(ISO 9650-1), Open sea (ISO 9650-1) + equipment pack > 24 hrs.
<b>BOMBARD</b>	(ISO 9650-1), Bip (ISO 9650-1) + equipment pack > 24 hrs.
<b>SEAGO</b>	(ISO 9650-1) + equipment pack > 24 hrs.
<b>SEASAFE</b>	(ISO 9650-1) + equipment pack > 24 hrs.

**PLEASE NOTE**

**The skipper is responsible for ensuring that the life raft and equipment carried on board are suitable for the type of voyage and the body of water concerned. Life rafts must meet the requirements of ISO standard 9650-1 (preferably Group A life rafts with double floor).**

Life rafts must be periodically inspected (in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications) by a specialised workshop, and must contain at least the following items:

- floatable rescue quoit with at least 30 metres of floatable line
- 1 bailer
- Repair kit for air chambers
- 1 corrosion resistant measuring beaker
- Instructions for survival
- First aid kit
- 6 seasickness tablets per person
- 1.5 litres of drinking water per person
- 0.5 kg emergency food rations (10,000 kJ) per person
- 1 Signal mirror
- waterproof flashlight, suitable for signalling
- 2 parachute rockets
- 6 red automatic smoke signals
- 1 whistle
- 2 paddles
- 2 sponges
- 1 bellows / pump
- 1 knife
- 1 sea anchor
- Seasickness bags

Equipment may be packed in a separate container, but this must be attached to the life raft.

**Additional requirements for ocean voyages (e.g. Atlantic crossings):**

- Spare batteries and bulbs for flashlight
- 1 orange smoke signal
- 1 fishing kit
